Welcome! Thank you for joining us in studying through Acts!

The book of Acts tells the story of how the Gospel of Jesus spread throughout the world of the first century A.D. and one man (Paul) was especially

instrumental in that effort. Paul not only traveled on multiple journeys speaking the Gospel and starting new churches, but he also wrote letters to many of those new congregations. The Bible includes 13 of those letters!

we continue our study in Acts, our

midweek studies occasionally will focus on one of those letters (also called epistles). Tonight we will be in I Thessalonians, a letter written to the church in Thessalonica. Shortly after Paul was forced out of that city, he traveled to the city of Corinth where he penned

this letter. That visit to Thessalonica is recorded in Acts 17, during Paul's second missionary journey. - Think back: What happened in Thessalonica? How did that church begin? Why did Paul leave that city? Paul was in Corinth at the time of
